Reflection

This Sunday, which is All Saints Day, and next Sunday, which is Remembrance Sunday, are both days of Remembering. We will as parish churches, mark these days in a rather different way than in previous years because we cannot gather in large numbers, as we have done in the past. It is my prayer that the very fact that things are different will help us to press new meaning into them in these troubled times. But, as every year we will remember and honour the lives of those who have died and name them before God.

I have wept many tears this week because there are other deaths, and there are other names. These too are deaths that it would be right to hold before God in this Season of Remembering.

As I have watched the News, I have wept for young parents Rasul Iran Nezhad and Shiva Mohammad Panahi, and their children - Anita who was 9 and Armin who was 6. They had another child too. Their youngest son Artim was just 15 months old – but as I write, his small body has not yet been found. The family drowned because a boat carrying refugees sank just a few miles away from us here, in the English Channel off Dunkirk. They left their country of Iran because they were fleeing from hardship and discrimination as Iranian Kurds. They tried to come to Britain because they sought asylum, wanting to be in a country where they believed they would find refuge, freedom, kindness and a place of hope where they could see their children thrive and

learn and grow. They thought they would find those things in Britain. Who am I to say that they were mistaken?

Pause for a moment and reflect how desperate your life must be that you would travel 6000 miles, and finally face the bleak November waters of the Channel in an inadequate boat with your terrified young children. Just the thought of that makes me want to go and hug my young grandchildren close to me and give thanks that their parents are not faced with such a stark choice.

I am not going to take sides in the political wrangling that surrounds this topic of refugees. But whatever your position *surely* we must all agree that a better way must be found so that small children and desperate adults do not die in the waters off our shores.

Please, go to your Bible and read again that first part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.
"Blessed are the poor in spirit.... Blessed are the meek.... Blessed are those that are persecuted..." Reverend Ren
