Reflection

The Romans reading for this Sunday reminds us that we are all different, we have different strengths and weaknesses and that we all approach things in different ways. We all come from a different starting point both in our everyday lives and also in our faith journeys. The only constant in all our lives is that we are all equal in the eyes of God. It is for this reason alone that we must remember that it is not our place to judge others, however tempting that may be. When we judge others based on our own opinions, our personal preferences and our own experiences we are putting our own weaknesses on show. The only person we are accountable to is Christ, it is his place to judge not ours. We stand before him presenting our own actions to him – not those of our neighbours – and it will be those actions alone which he will judge.

Forgiveness is an original and basic element of our Christian life, Jesus holds it up as a model by which we should live and by which we will be judged. As in all matters we have a choice, we can choose who and when we will forgive BUT given that God frequently forgives us as flawed individuals should that not compel us to offer the same forgiveness to others? God's forgiveness of us is a free and generous gift which begins the process of growth, change and transformation, a process which can bring about healing and reconciliation not only for ourselves but for others as well.

I recently found this story which illustrates today's readings-

The owner of a successful company was asked what he attributed the success of his company to. His reply was "forgiveness". He went on to say that his "employees were given big jobs and big responsibilities and inevitably they made mistakes, they learn, we forgive and they don't make the same mistake again."

Throughout life we are all given large tasks and huge responsibilities, we all make mistakes and mess things up, not intentionally but just because we are human. For me being a parent for the first time was the biggest learning curve of all. But as in all areas of our lives, if we know that we will be forgiven for our mistakes and not punished, we do grow in confidence, something which benefits everybody. So let us be kind to ourselves, asking for forgiveness for ourselves and being prepared to forgive others.

Prayer

Let us pray for our families, our church communities and our places of work. May they all be places where it is possible to make mistakes and where forgiveness is at the centre. Give us the courage to ask for forgiveness for ourselves and in turn pass that forgiveness onto others. Amen. Rev'd Sue
